Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

ADVENT – THE BEGINNING OF A NEW CHURCH YEAR...

This Sunday we light the first candle in our Advent Wreath and begin the journey toward Christmas – the celebration of the birth of Jesus.

Before we arrive at Christmas though we spend these four Sundays in Advent thinking about the gift that Jesus is to us – Light in the darkness; and taking a look at ourselves to make sure that all is well with our soul...

Advent is divided up into two parts – the first part we think about Jesus promise to return as king of the world and to bring about the kingdom of heaven on earth; the second half after 16th December, we prepare for the joy of the incarnation – Jesus coming to us as the babe of Bethlehem.

Advent, just like Lent, is a penitential season – a spiritual 'spring clean' just as we like to get our homes ready for the big celebration on Christmas Day, this is the opportunity to not only make sure we are ready to receive the Christ child into our hearts but that we are ready to welcome Jesus when he comes again.

So, the four candles of Advent, the first of which will be lit today – these represent all the people throughout Holy Scripture who were told to prepare for the coming of the Christ – God's Son, they also



remind us of promises God made to these folk – the promise that the Christ child would bring with him Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.

The St Francis Advent Wreath and the church clothed in purple – the colour of Advent.

ST FRANCIS NEWS...

Sad to say that we are no longer able to use the gas cooker in the kitchen here at St Francis.

A recent gas check has revealed that the gas installation to the cooker does not meet newly introduced safety regulations.

At the PCC meeting held on Thursday evening it was reluctantly decided that we are not in a position to meet the cost of bringing the gas installation up to the legally required standard at this time and so the cooker has been disconnected and the gas supply capped off.

It is hoped that a working group will be formed in the new year that will look at the kitchen and the hall and propose plans for refurbishment of both these spaces for future church and community use.
